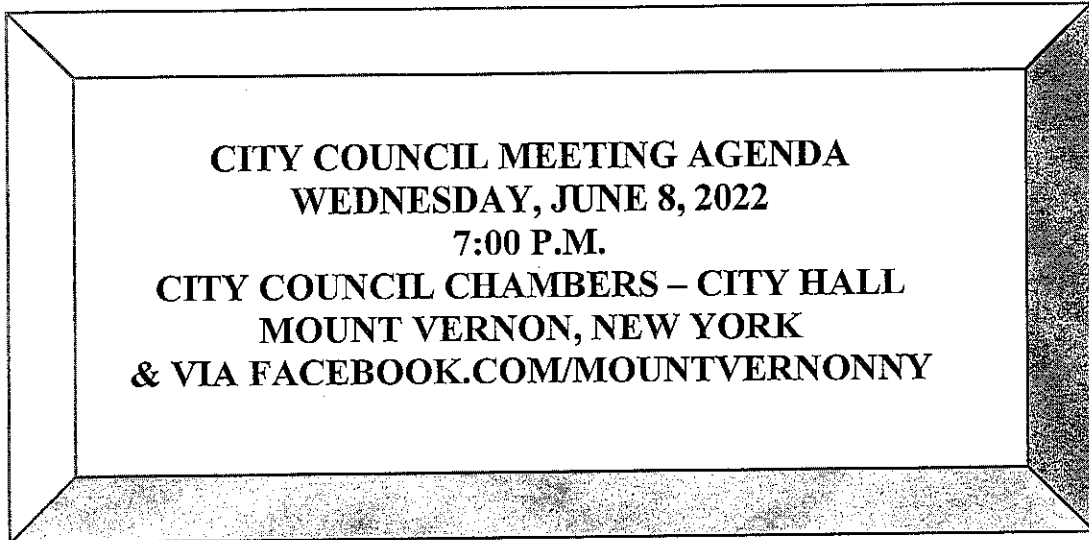

**PROCLAMATION OF THE CITY OF MOUNT VERNON, NY
DESIGNATING JUNE 2022 AS LGBTQIA+ PRIDE MONTH**

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Mount Vernon, NY welcomes and encourages diversity and inclusion in our community; and

WHEREAS, every June, communities across the United States celebrate the contributions of the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, Intersex and Asexual, and Plus (LGBTQIA+) community and commemorate those individuals who fight to secure equality, who experienced discrimination and have historically been disenfranchised of rights afforded to other Americans; and

WHEREAS, the LGBTQIA+ community has had immeasurable impact on the cultural, civic and economic successes of our country; and

WHEREAS, celebrating Pride Month raises awareness and provides support and advocacy for the State of New York's and the County of Westchester's LGBTQIA+ community, and is an opportunity to take action and engage in dialogue to strengthen alliances, build acceptance and advance equal rights; and

WHEREAS, while there has been remarkable progress towards acceptance and equality, members of the LGBTQIA+ community continue to face discrimination, intolerance, and hate; and

WHEREAS, we must commit to supporting and accepting our LGBTQIA+ individuals, in particular our youth, who compared to their peers are far more likely to experience violence and bullying at school; to suffer from depression; to struggle with substance use; and to have attempted suicide; and

WHEREAS, we must remain vigilant in deterring oppression and discrimination against people on the basis of sex, gender identity or expression, or sexual orientation; and

WHEREAS, all human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights, and by protecting the rights of every individual, we enhance and strengthen the value of everyone throughout society; and

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF MANAGEMENT SERVICES TO PURCHASE 100 LENOVO THINKPADS FOR CITY HALL AND THE POLICE DEPARTMENT WITH ARPA FUNDS

WHEREAS, by letter dated May 18, 2022, the Commissioner of the Department of Management Services has requested legislation authorizing said department to purchase 100 Lenovo ThinkPads for City Hall and the Police Department with ARPA funds in order to facilitate remote work in light of COVID 19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, our computers are on average over 7 years old, slow, and do not support remote work. The one hundred (100) laptops were purchased for the PD and City Hall to replace the old desktops and provide portability to use anywhere. The purchase of laptops is one of the City's "Mitigation measurements in small business, nonprofits, and impacted industries and as a COVID-19 mitigation and prevention measure to enable safe reopening." SHI International Corp. is a preferred vendor, NYS OGS contract 22802 and have quoted an amount of \$195,000.00 for one hundred (100) laptops; NOW, THEREFORE,

The City of Mount Vernon, in City Council convened, does hereby ordain and enact:

Section 1. The Commissioner of the Department of Management Services has requested legislation authorizing said department to purchase 100 Lenovo ThinkPads for City Hall and the Police Department with ARPA funds in order to facilitate remote work in light of COVID 19 pandemic.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS TO PURCHASE 2,000 CITY-OWNED RECYCLE BINS USING ARPA FUNDS

WHEREAS, by letter dated June 2, 2022, the Commissioner of the Department of Public Works has requested legislation authorizing said department to purchase 2,000 City-owned recycle bins and lids using ARPA funds at a total cost of \$59,850.00; and

WHEREAS, the City of Mount Vernon has the potential to divert approximately 500,000 pounds (250 tons) of recyclables by purchasing and distributing 2,000 32-gallon recycle binds and lids. The first phase of distributing 2,000 recycle bins, will be on a first come first serve basis to property owners in need and those who would like to participate; and

WHEREAS, as the City of Mount Vernon continues to encourage its residents and business owners to "Love Our City," the Department of Public Works is working on ways to improve our waste diversion rate. Waste diversion is the prevention and reduction of generated waste through source reduction, recycling, reuse, or composting. This solution generates a host of environmental, financial, and social benefits, including conserving energy, reducing disposal costs, and reducing the burden on landfills and other waste disposal methods; and

WHEREAS, Rehrig Pacific Company has been identified as the vendor to supply new city branded recycle bins and lids to be available to property owners on a first come first serve basis. The recycle bins are City property, if the property owner chooses to sell their property, the recycle bin must be returned to DPW. Rehrig Pacific Company has quoted the City of Mount Vernon the amount of \$59,850.00 for 2,000 32-gallon recycle bins and lids via Sourcewell contract #041521-REH, which is a 25% discount of their regular price; NOW, THEREFORE,

The City of Mount Vernon in City Council convened, does hereby ordain and enact:

Section 1. The Department of Public Works is hereby authorized to purchase 2,000 City-owned recycle bins and lids using ARPA funds at a total cost of \$59,850.00.

Section 2. Funds for the aforesaid is available through the American Rescue Plan – Negative Economic Impacts – Streetscape Litter Reduction (A8170.447ARP).

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect upon its approval by the Board of Estimate and Contract.

WHEREAS, by letter dated May 13, 2022, the WOMEN & MEN OF EXCELLENCE OUTREACH MINISTRIES celebrating its 16th year in ministry, in association with Judah Prayer Deliverance Ministries, has requested permission to host a Weekend Revival of Restoration & Increased Faith in a Block Party Explosion on Saturday, June 25, 2022 (rain date: Saturday, July 2, 2022) from 1:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. at Howe Park, 3rd Street & Fulton Avenue; NOW, THEREFORE,

The City of Mount Vernon, in City Council convened, does hereby ordain, and enact:

Section 1. Permission is hereby granted to the WOMEN & MEN OF EXCELLENCE OUTREACH MINISTRIES, in association with Judah Prayer Deliverance Ministries to host a Weekend Revival of Restoration & Increased Faith in a Block Party Explosion on Saturday, June 25, 2022 (rain date: Saturday, July 2, 2022) from 1:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. at Howe Park, 3rd Street & Fulton Avenue.

Section 2. The permission hereby granted is conditioned upon the aforesaid location being maintained, cleaned, and kept in good condition by the WOMEN & MEN OF EXCELLENCE OUTREACH MINISTRIES, in association with Judah Prayer Deliverance Ministries at its sole cost and expense during said event. The permission hereby granted is further conditioned upon the maintenance, by the WOMEN & MEN OF EXCELLENCE OUTREACH MINISTRIES, its members, and guests, of access to such streets at all times for emergency services in the event of necessity therefor. The WOMEN & MEN OF EXCELLENCE OUTREACH MINISTRIES shall also be responsible for the observance by its members and guests of all conditions of this ordinance.

Section 3. The foregoing permission is granted upon the express condition that the WOMEN & MEN OF EXCELLENCE OUTREACH MINISTRIES, in association with Judah Prayer Deliverance Ministries shall assume all liability for and will indemnify and hold the City of Mount Vernon harmless of and from any and all damage that may occur to persons or property by reason of the holding of said block party, and that the WOMEN & MEN OF EXCELLENCE OUTREACH MINISTRIES before acting upon this ordinance, shall file with the City Clerk and subject to approval by the Corporation Counsel, a public liability policy covering the City of Mount

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Vernon as additional insured with policy limits of at least \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence.

Section 4. The Department of Public Safety has authorized the use and/or set up of electricity for the purpose of the aforesaid block party on Saturday, June 25, 2022 (rain date: Saturday, July 2, 2022) from 1:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. at Howe Park, across from 205 West 3rd Street.

Section 5. In the event that personnel are needed to direct traffic and provide for the safety of persons and property in conjunction with said event, the Women & Men of Excellence Outreach Ministries, in association with Judah Prayer Deliverance Ministries shall reimburse the City for the overtime costs of the number of police officers determined to be necessary for these purposes at the sole discretion of the Chief of the Department of Public Safety.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect only upon the filing of the above-described documents in the office of the City Clerk of Mount Vernon.

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AN ORDINANCE GRANTING PERMISSION TO
UNITY BAPTIST TABERNACLE TO HOLD A BLOCK
EVENT ENTITLED "UNITY AND THE COMMUNITY"
AND TO THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY
TO CLOSE EAST SECOND STREET BETWEEN
FIRST AND SECOND AVENUES

WHEREAS, by letter dated April May 24, 2022, UNITY BAPTIST TABERNACLE has requested permission to hold the annual "Unity and the Community" block event on Sunday, June 26, 2022, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.; and

WHEREAS, UNITY BAPTIST TABERNACLE further requests the Department of Public Safety to close East Second Street between First and Second Avenues; NOW, THEREFORE,

The City of Mount Vernon, in City Council convened, does hereby ordain and enact:

Section 1. Permission is hereby granted to UNITY BAPTIST TABERNACLE to hold the annual "Unity and the Community" block event on Sunday, June 26, 2022, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.

Section 2. The Department of Public Safety is hereby authorized and directed to close East Second Street between First and Second Avenues for the purpose of the aforesaid event on Sunday, June 26, 2022, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.

Section 3. The Parking Bureau is hereby authorized and directed to post "no parking" signs in the area seventy-two (72) hours prior to the event and/or the use of electricity is permitted. The Department of Public Works provide barricades at the intersections of East 2nd Street and South 1st Avenue and East 2nd Street and South 2nd Avenue to stop East and West bound traffic on East 2nd Street, and Auxiliary police are to be utilized for traffic control for both safety and interaction in the community.

Section 4. The use of the aforesaid streets for the aforesaid purpose shall be under the supervision of the Department of Public Works. During the use of said streets, it shall be maintained, cleaned and kept in good condition by said UNITY BAPTIST TABERNACLE at its own expense. The permission hereby granted is further conditioned upon the maintenance of access to such street at all times for emergency service in the event of necessity therefor.

Section 5. The foregoing permission is granted upon the express condition that said UNITY BAPTIST TABERNACLE shall assume all liability for and will indemnify and hold the City of Mount Vernon harmless of and from any and all damages that occur to persons or property by reason of the holding of said "Annual Unity and the Community Block Party" block event and with respect to the use of the rolling platform, and that said UNITY BAPTIST TABERNACLE before acting upon this ordinance, shall file with the City Clerk and to be approved by the Corporation Counsel, a public liability insurance policy covering the City of Mount Vernon as an additional insured with policy limits of at least \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence.

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Section 6. In the event that personnel are needed to direct traffic and provide for the safety of persons and property in conjunction with said event, the UNITY BAPTIST TABERNACLE shall reimburse the City for the overtime costs of the number of police officers deemed necessary in the sole discretion of the Commissioner of Public Safety, for these purposes.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect only upon the filing of the above-described documents in the office of the City Clerk of Mount Vernon.

WHEREAS, BISHOP ELECT SR. PASTOR BARRY ADDISON received Jesus Christ at the age of 16 years old and is still strongly and faithfully dedicated to serving, the body of Christ; and
